

## **Policies and Procedures**

# Site Policies

#### **PURPOSE**

This document defines the policy and procedures for operating offsite catteries.

#### **SCOPE**

This policy applies to all offsite cat program staff and volunteers.

#### **POLICY**

APA! offsite cat program staff and volunteers will operate offsite catteries in accordance with the documented procedures.

## **PROCEDURES**

## Sending cats offsite

- a. Find out how many cats are needed at each site.
- b. Use the procedures in this document to determine which cats to send to the different APA! offsite locations.
- c. Print out medical records for each cat and place them inside of each cat's folder.
- d. Print out/locate rabies certificate (if required) for each cat and place it inside of cat's folder.

#### General rules

- All cats going offsite should be spayed/neutered. Tarrytown is the only exception.
- All cats going offsite should be healthy or at least not contagious.
- Cats going offsite should have vaccines that are as up to date as possible given the age of the cats in question.
- Only Tarrytown, and PETCO locations can accept a FIV+ cat.

## PetSmart guidelines (applies to all PetSmart locations)

- Cats must be healthy, not on any medications or special diets.
- Rabies & FVRCP vaccines must be up to date.
- All cats must have a current, signed rabies certificate in their folder.
- Cats should ideally not be missing any limbs, eyes, etc., or be "imperfect" in any way.
- Adult cats must be okay going into single enclosures.
- Kittens must get along as they will be placed inside of a kitty condo designed for a small group of kittens.

#### Petco guidelines

- Rabies & FVRCP vaccines should ideally be up to date but this is not a requirement.
- Rabies certificate should be transported with cat but this is not a requirement.
- Cats must be group-room ready and cat-friendly.
- Cats should ideally be healthy, however, cats can be on once daily meds if their illness is not contagious and their meds do not need to be refrigerated.
- Cats cannot be on special diets.
- Kittens may be younger than 4 months, but must have had at least two FVRCP boosters.

## **Tarrytown guidelines**

- Rabies & FVRCP vaccines should be up to date but this is not a requirement.
- Rabies certificate should be transported with cat but this is not a requirement.
- Can take cat-friendly FIV+ cats.
- Can take some cats on special diets -- ask first though.
- Can take cats deemed "imperfect" by PetSmart.
- Cats can be on refrigerated meds.
